Harmonize Greenhouse Gas Emissions Reporting

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Background

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Align reporting and requirements both nationally and globally, which will harmonize approaches with other applicable climate-related disclosures requirements and deadlines.



Allow the emergence of an industry consensus from a choice of protocols instead of having the government dictate which protocols should be used.

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Provide adequate phase-in periods for new commitments.

Allow for a longer phase-in period for the disclosure of Scope 3 emissions to allow industry groups to forge consensus for data reporting.

Streamline reporting requirements for small and private companies to lessen the financial burden for these suppliers.
